REFLECTION Jubilee Year-Pilgrims of Hope

Hope is rooted in God's promise of love and protection: "For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope" (Jeremiah 29:11). Romans 5. 3-5 says: suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. Hope keeps us from discouragement and despair and let us know we are not alone.

After the flame of hope is kindled in us, there can be times when it risks being extinguished by the worries, fears and pressures of daily life.
